We request your assistance in soliciting applications for the 2010 Rocky Mountain Coal Mining Institute scholarship program. The year 2010 will be the 26<sup>th</sup> time the Institute has awarded scholarships to collegiate sophomores and juniors. Since the program was initiated in 1984, 372 scholarship awards totaling \$478,250 have been presented to 203 students. RMCMCI offers two separate scholarships:

- Eight Engineering/Geology Scholarships – now \$5,000 (\$2,500 per year for two years) for those attending a 4-year University. Winners of the Engineering/Geology Scholarship will be guests at the 106<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting and Convention in Midway, Utah, June 27-29, 2010, to receive their awards.
- Eight Technical/Trade School Scholarship (*new in 2007*) - \$1,000 (one year) for those attending a technical/trade school.

2. Both a U.S. citizen and a legal resident of one of the Rocky Mountain Coal Mining Institute member states: Arizona, Colorado, Montana, New Mexico, North Dakota, Texas, Utah or Wyoming;
3. Pursuing a degree in a mining-related field or in the engineering disciplines such as mining, geology, mineral processing, metallurgy, electrical, mechanical and environmental; and
4. Interest in Western coal as a career path.

No applications will be accepted after that date. Prospective candidates will be interviewed during February. Scholarship winners will be selected and notified in early March 2010.

Note: The scholarship is presented at the close of the winner's sophomore or junior year at the Institute's annual convention. The winners will be guests of the Institute at the 2010 meeting at the Zermatt Resort in Midway, UT, June 27-29, 2010. The scholarship is a continuing one and may be renewed at the close of the recipients' junior or senior year upon recommendation of the dean of the college or university involved and provided the recipient is still a full-time student and continues to meet the criteria of the RMCMI scholarship committee. This year, the scholarship is valued at \$2,500 and is sent directly to the college or university to be used as a tuition credit with \$1,250 being credited each semester.
